
# Fr. Joseph's Corner "The Old Man in the Village"

The whole village gathered together to see him, and the old man was asked: "What happened to you?"





# **Today's Homily**



TODAY'S GOSPEL may be read on two different levels. On one, Luke seems to set his story in a Christian community in which many are poor but several are wealthy. That people meet in houses implies that some in the Church had houses large enough to entertain 50 or more people at a time. Luke places this story during Jesus' journey to Jerusalem, which is devoted to teachings on discipleship. Jesus describes how Christians are to act when meeting for their Eucharistic meal. They should not try to sit at the place of honor next to the host or owner of the house/ church. Instead, they should humble themselves and seek a lesser seat. The ideal is to respect the communal meal as a celebration of the Body of Christ rather than simply as an opportunity for networking or self glorifying.

On the other level, Luke addresses discipleship beyond the early Church. The "Wedding Banquet" (Luke 14:8) is a common image used by the prophets for the Kingdom of God. The term "invited" (14:7, 8) is the same used to describe those in the Christian community who have been "called" by God to receive the Gospel of Christ in hope of salvation. In this case, when joined to God's Kingdom in the Body of Christ, we should not presume to place ourselves above other members—but we should live in humility. This becomes a key aspect of discipleship in all four Gospel accounts: to live humbly as Christ did.

Luke then combines the two levels in the closing section, advising would-be-hosts to invite not simply the wealthy and powerful, but the poor and needy, too, to the Gospel message. The Body of Christ should be glorified by the grace that humble members show to the less fortunate.

When is the last time you felt humbled? Today's first reading may challenge those of us who cherish accolades and achievements-so, likely all of us! Being recognized or thanked for our work isn't a bad thing in itself. But Sirach reminds us that God does not work on a merit system. God doesn't need you to do anything special or to be anyone else in order to be fully loved. We only need to humbly accept God's gifts—and give thanks.

Do you have a "go to" seat at family parties? Perhaps, it's the head of the table or smack in the middle. Maybe you're a left-side person, or you relish your seat at the kids' table. We all get into routines. Today, Jesus jars us out of our comfortable spaces, and He calls us to make room for the lowly and the least.

Jesus challenges the dinner host—and all of us to go beyond giving alms to giving of yourself in relationship with people on the margins.
